AS THE MUSLIM RULER OF A MUSLIM-MAJORITY EMPIRE, GHAZAN MUST BE ABLE TO PRESENT HIMSELF AS THE PROTECTOR OF ISLAM. BUT HE ALSO NEEDED TO BE ABLE TO RULE A DIVERSE POPULATION OF JEWS, BUDDHISTS, ZOROASTRIANS, AND CHRISTIANS, AND TO APPEAR POWERFUL TO TRADERS FROM AROUND THE WORLD.
