

# PARENT QUICKSTART GUIDE



Your kids are home from school. You're home from work. You want to try out the Big History Project (BHP) course. Where to start?

There's an overwhelming amount of information and advice out there about online learning, and it's a lot to juggle when you have limited time to try and establish new routines at home. This Parent Quickstart Guide offers three steps each with increasing in level of engagement—to help you get started with BHP. While BHP was designed for *classrooms*, this guide is structured to help parents navigate the course. You'll also find links to more in-depth information. ### Step One

The Big History Project curriculum is hosted on Khan Academy, a platform designed for solo learners. It's a great way for your child to work through the BHP course and it allows you to have insight into their progress. Ready? Let's do this!

Khan Academy has created robust resources to help parents navigate their site, with detailed instructions for creating both parent and student accounts.

### Step Two

Talk to other parents! Big History Project supports a vibrant, supportive community of parents who are teaching the course. Additionally, you can find advice from veteran BHP teachers in the community. To access the community:

- 1. Register for a teacher account by visiting bighistoryproject.com.
- 2. Click on the REGISTER button under TEACHERS.



3. When you register, you will be asked to enter the name of your school. Please register as a Home School (do not enter the school that your child normally attends). It's WAY down at the bottom of the list. This will let us know to send you resources that best fit your situation.

- 4. After you have registered, you will receive a confirmation email from Big History Project with the subject Confirm your account. If it doesn't show up in your inbox pretty quickly, check your spam/junk folder. It's probably there.
- 5. Once you are registered and logged in, click **Community** from the home page.

- 6. Follow the prompts to join the community.

#### Step Three

Help your child practice and improve their writing skills! BHP offers BHP Score, a free essay-scoring service that gives students and teachers immediate writing feedback. The feedback is based on the BHP Writing Rubric and is provided via Turnitin's Revision Assistant. You will receive your child's results, which you can then use to review and strategize with your child on how to improve their writing. We have a BHP Score Guide that is indispensable for activating and using this service, but FIRST, make sure your child has a student account! You will need to have a Teacher BHP account (see above if you haven't created one yet). Now, you'll need to sign up your child for a student account. Here's how:

1. Click on **Console** at the top of the screen.



2. Next, click the Manage Classes tab along the top.



3. Click ADD PERIOD. Your new period is created and Period 1 is added to the Manage Classes page.



4. Click on Invite Students. The Join Class dialog box opens. Take note of the CLASSROOM CODE.

- 6. Your child will get an email (have them check their spam/junk folder if it doesn't appear in their inbox.
- 7. Once they click on the link in the email, they will be taken to the login page to create a password.
